The company replied with customized emails that said, "Your dream dress is crying in your cart—set it free!" and provided modest, temporary savings. Thousands of ghost consumers were turned into actual buyers thanks to this tactic! The AI That Assumed Pajamas Were Suitable for Social Events- Artificial intelligence (AI) was used by a large fashion retailer to analyze shopping trends (Sylvestre). One day, the AI began suggesting silk pajamas as "perfect party outfits." The marketing team was perplexed and discovered that the AI had been trained on data from the 2020 pandemic, when people were wearing pajamas all day, even to Zoom parties! Rather than correcting the AI right away, the brand capitalized on the error by releasing a collection called "Party in Pajamas," which proved that even data-driven errors can lead to fashion triumphs (Wayne)!

The "Invisible Man" Who Kept Buying Dresses- A consumer had ordered more than fifty outfits for women, but they were always returned right away, according to a fashion e-commerce site. This was identified as anomalous activity using data analytics. Following further research, it was discovered that the "customer" was actually a social media personality who was "borrowing" clothing for Instagram photographs and then returning it! In response, the company introduced a "Fashion Rental Subscription" that lets customers borrow clothes for a price rather than giving them back. This created a lucrative business model out of a cunning trend (Unknown Author)!
