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İngilis dilində ünsiyyətdə emojilər və vizual elementlər

Xülasə

Son onilliklərdə rəqəmsal ünsiyyət emojilərin və digər vizual elementlərin geniş yayılması nəticəsində köklü şəkildə dəyişmişdir. Bu semiotik vasitələr sosial media platformalarında, mesajlaşma tətbiqlərində və onlayn icmalarda ingilisdilli ünsiyyətin ayrılmaz hissəsinə çevrilmişdir. These patterns highlight the sociolinguistic role of emojis as markers of identity and social behavior in English digital discourse. (Barton & Lee, 2013).

On platforms such as Twitter (X), Instagram, WhatsApp, and Slack, emojis fulfill different communicative functions depending on audience, context, and design.
